Post-9/11 GI Bill Transferability of Benefits

The Post-9/11 GI Bill Transferability bill has been signed and as of June 29, 2009 the service member can go online to www.dmdc.osd.mil/TEB to transfer their benefits to their spouse or child(ren).

Eligible Individuals:

- Any member of the Armed Forces on or after August 1, 2009, who at the time of the approval of the individual's request to transfer entitlement is eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill, and
- Has at least 6 years of service in the Armed Forces on the date of election and agrees to serve 4 additional years in the Armed Forces from the date of election, or
- Has at least 10 years of service in the Armed Forces on the date of election, is precluded by either standard policy (Service or DoD) or statute from committing to 4 additional years, and agrees to serve for the maximum amount of time allowed by such policy or statute, or
- Is or becomes retirement eligible during the period of August 1, 2009 through August 1, 2013 and agrees to serve the additional period:
 - ◆ Service members with an approved retirement date on or after August 1, 2009 and before July 1, 2010 have no additional service requirements.
 - ◆ Service members eligible for retirement after August 1, 2009 and before August 1, 2010 will be required to serve 1 year of additional service.
 - ◆ Service members eligible for retirement on or after August 1, 2010 and before August 1, 2011, will be required to serve 2 years of additional service.
 - ◆ Service members eligible for retirement on or after August 1, 2011 and before August 1, 2012, will be required to serve 3 years of additional service.

PLEASE note that the service obligation starts WHEN the service member submits his/her application for transferability, but the transfer date will be noted as either on or after August 1, 2009.

Post-9/11 GI Bill Transferability of Benefits (continued)

Eligible Family Members: A family member must be enrolled in the Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting System (DEERS) and be eligible for benefits at the time of transfer in order to receive transferred educational benefits. Eligible family members include the following:

- ◆ Spouse
- ◆ One or more of the individual's children
- ◆ A combination of the individuals referred to above

Months of Transfer: Months of transfer must be in whole months. The number of months of benefits transferred by an individual may not exceed the lesser of:

- ◆ The months of unused benefits available under the Post-9/11 GI Bill, or
- ◆ 36 months

Transferee Usage: Dependent use of transferred educational benefits is subject to the following:

Spouse:

- a. May start to use the benefit after the service member has completed at least 6 years of service.
- b. May use the benefit while the member remains in the Armed Forces or after separation from active duty after completing the additional service required to transfer the educational assistance.
- c. Is subject to the same 15-year limitation as the eligible individual.
- d. Is not eligible for the monthly stipend or books and supplies stipend while the service member is serving on active duty.

Child:

- a. May start to use the benefit after the service member has completed at least 10 years of service.
- b. May use the benefit while the eligible individual remains in the Armed Forces or after separation from active duty after completing the additional service required to transfer the education assistance.
- c. May not use the benefit until they have attained a secondary school diploma (or equivalency certificate) or reached 18 years of age.
- d. Is not subject to the time limitation of 15 years, but may not use the benefit after reaching 26 years of age.
- e. Is entitled to the monthly stipend and books supplies stipend even though the service member is on active duty.
